The Jesuit Retreat Center of Los Altos has been blessed to provide a ministry of the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius Loyola to the local community of the Church since 1925.

The *Spiritual Exercises* have provided, for countless people of faith from all walks of life, a school of affective prayer, a context for wise discernment, and a path toward deepening intimacy with God in Christ. The *Exercises* continue, through the Spirit, to lead hearts to awareness of blessing, to gratitude for God's gifts, to generosity in discipleship, and to freedom for service, for doing God's loving will.

The Jesuit Retreat Center staff and our partners in mission share a ministry built on the rich Ignatian and Jesuit heritage and rooted in the Sacred Scriptures of our Christian and Catholic tradition. We offer a variety of group retreat programs for a broad range of persons, individually-directed retreats and spiritual direction for people seeking personal guidance on their journeys of prayer, and sacramental services complementing our retreat programs and enriching the retreatants whom the Spirit leads here.

Many of our retreats invite the participants to share the retreat days in silent companionship. In the shared and sacred silence, each person respectfully gives God's gentle voice an opening to touch each one's heart. Our offerings include Recovery retreats for women and men in 12-Step programs, retreats tailored for young adults (with peer leadership), retreats for homeless women and men, and more. In addition to our own spiritual retreat programs, held primarily on weekends, the Jesuit Retreat Center hosts, for their own

retreats, Catholic school groups, mainly high school and college, and select nonprofit organizations.

The Retreat Center, situated on 38 wooded acres in the serene hills above Los Altos, is easily accessible from major highways. The JRC's tranquil surroundings enhance reflection. Outdoor shrines and dramatic trails provide an opportunity for contemplation in a natural setting, and Rossi Chapel welcomes retreatants for silent meditation and for communal liturgical worship. Nourishing and abundant meals, served in a dining room with a panoramic view, complement well the rich spiritual nourishment.

Our modest retreat fees cover, in a typical year, about a third of the expenses we face. We are profoundly grateful to our many benefactors, whose generosity makes it possible for us to provide this ministry today and, following the example of our predecessors, to maintain and develop both programs and facilities for future generations of retreatants. We ask, especially, the support of your prayers for this ministry and for all who seek God here in days of retreat.

Finding God in All Things - A Vision of Faith

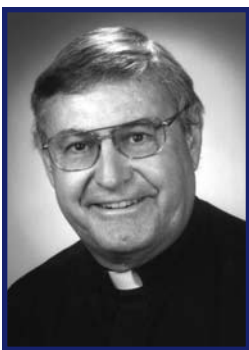

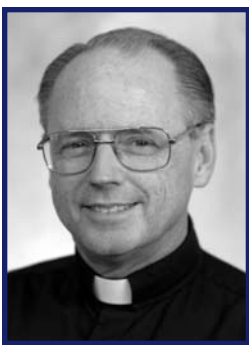

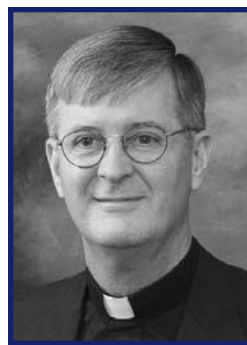
What Are You Waiting For?

December 6, 2006 - Fr. Thomas J. Carroll, S.J.

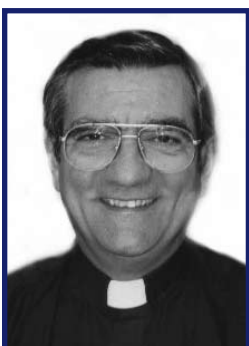

Refund Policy: For cancellations received less than ten days prior to the start of retreat, the deposit is not refundable.

Weekend retreats start with registration on Friday, 5–6:30 p.m., a 6:30 reception, then dinner. They conclude with lunch on Sunday. Retreatant rooms are *en suite*. Retreats are for men and women, unless otherwise noted.

Days of Prayer begin with registration and continental breakfast at 9:30 a.m. The first conference is at 10:00. Each Day includes lunch and Eucharist and ends by 4:00 p.m.
